Randy's Story

Rachel and I are glad to be a part of the Elida Immanuel family. We are enjoying the continual process of getting to know each of you better. This is a wonderful church with a rich, spiritual heritage. We especially like the fact that this church believes in the authority of God's Word and stands firm on it. In this article, Rachel and I will attempt to share more of our story with you, so that you can come to know us better.

I grew up in a Christian home in small towns in rural Nebraska where my father was a United Methodist pastor and my mother taught school, sometimes in small one-room school houses. I am the oldest of three boys, Randy, Stan and Keith. My parents' names are Milan and Marjorie Coleman. You might be surprised, but everyone in our family is tall. My Dad in his prime stood about 6'3" and my mother at 5'8". In addition to my 6'6' frame, my brothers are 6'5" and 6'4" respectfully. So, around us, you feel as though you are in the land of the giants, even more so with tall cousins and now two tall children, Robert at 6'7" and Rebecca at 6'r". We could all be a basketball team.

I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior at the young age of 5 in a family devotional time. I had many times of rededication throughout my growing up years, but none so important as the full surrender to Christ at the altar of Hughes Auditorium at Asbury University in the fall of 1979. The Asbury years were a significant time of spiritual growth. And that's where Rachel and I met in a Sunday school class at Wilmore United Methodist Church during my sophomore year. We didn't start dating until the next year, however, and that's another story for another time. It's sufficient to say, that we fell in love very quickly and were later married after Rachel's graduation.

I went on to study at Asbury Seminary just across the street from the college in 1988 with a Master of Divinity degree. At the same time Rachel studied and taught at the University of Kentucky, and I was a student pastor at two small rural churches in northern Kentucky. During that time, Robert was born at Humana Hospital in Lexington on October 23, 1986.

After seminary, we went to Huntington, Indiana where I was an associate pastor at Trinity United Methodist Church from 1988-1991. Rebecca was born during that time at Bluffton Hospital on November 21, 1988. From there we went on to study Spanish in Costa Rica for one year from 1991 to '92, mostly for my benefit as Rachel already was fluent in Spanish. Our years of ministry in Ecuador of discipleship, pastoral, and training of national leaders, were remarkable years of God's blessings and growth in so many ways. I felt blessed to be a part of God's missionary force there. God's missionary gift that he planted within us has never left. It has continued strong stateside as well with our ministry to college students at Asbury and then lead pastorates at Belmont UMC in Dayton, and now here at Elida Immanuel Church. I sense it a great blessing to be here as your pastor. May God bless and guide us all.



VBS—SPORTS CAMP




Family Faith Idea

Messages are checked regularly Monday-Thursday during business hours. Over the weekend, in case of an emergency (life threatening illness or death) please call the parsonage @ 567-712-6765. (NOTE: this is a land line—will not accept text messages)

When you check in at the hospital and they ask you for "your religion", please inform them you go to Elida Immanuel Church. (And even then, we sometimes do not get contacted by the hospital) If you simply say that you are protestant or United Methodist, they do not contact the church. It is our job as a church to support you in times of sickness, and your communication is an important part of the equation. Thank you for your help.
