Pastor Connection

Dear Friends,

I greet you in the name of our risen Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I hope you are still basking in the afterglow of what I thought was a glorious Easter. As I had said on that Sunday, it is my favorite Sunday of the year because Easter is the day that we celebrate our new life through the power of the resurrected Christ!

As I was writing this letter, I thought to myself that with the busy Easter season behind us, we might have a period of calm. However, now as the month of May is upon us and I look ahead at my calendar, I came to the stark realization that this period of busyness was going to become even more intense. The later I looked into May and June the more crowded the days became. For those of you who know me well, I am a planner. I also like to work ahead because I never know when the Lord might present a ministry opportunity, or a chance to spend time with someone who needs a friendly ear, or when there might be an emergency in someone's life where I can be of some assistance. Add to that, my transition into retirement and all that it entails.

It was in the midst of my obsession over "having everything in order" that the Lord spoke to my heart. I realized that I was expending so much of my energy and attention on accomplishing what I deemed to be important, that I was not thinking about where God fit into my schedule. Now, when I say that, I don't mean spending personal devotional time with God or placing God at the center of my sermon preparation, etc. What I was convicted of is leaving God out of the planning process. Do you see what I mean? "I" was doing all the planning. "I" was making sure that "I" had everything in place. "I" was in charge of "my" schedule. Friends, I was leaving God out of the entire process. I wasn't asking God what it was that He wanted me to do. I was too busy taking care of what I thought was best, and what I thought would be pleasing to Him.

Jesus had something to say about people who allow themselves to become so enthralled with the work itself, that they lose perspective on what is really important. Luke 10:38-42 is the account of Mary and Martha. Despite Martha's busyness, Mary had the right idea: to spend time at the Master's feet. Yes, it is ok to be busy and to plan, but not at the expense of what is really important. When I read this passage, I was convicted. I will continue to plot and plan, but not at the expense of what is really important.

So as you look at your busy schedule this spring, filled with ball games, family events, work, and the like, don't forget what is really important. Keep the Lord at the center of your schedule and include Him in your planning process. More importantly, before you do anything else, remember to first spend some time at the feet of the great Teacher.

Kidz Konnect Passover Meal



Anthony Spencer is egotistical, proud of being a selfmade business success at the peak of his game, even though the cost of winning was painfully high. A cerebral hemorrhage leaves Tony comatose in a hospital ICU. He "awakens" to find himself in a surreal world, a "living" landscape that mirrors dimensions of his earthly life, from the beautiful to the corrupt. It is here that he has vivid interactions with others he assumes are projections of his own subconscious, but whose directions he follows nonetheless with the possibility that they might lead to authenticity and, perhaps, redemption. The adventure draws Tony into deep relational entanglements where he is able to "see" through the literal eyes and experiences of others, but is "blind" to the consequences of hiding his personal agenda and loss that emerge to war against the processes of healing and trust. Will this unexpected coalescing of events cause Tony to examine his life and realize he built of house of cards on the poisoned grounds of a broken heart? Will he also have the courage to make a critical choice that can undo a major injustice he set in motion before falling into a coma?

(NOTE: this is a land line—will not accept text messages)

When you check in at the hospital and they ask you for "your religion", please inform them you go to Elida Immanuel Church. (And even then, we sometimes do not get contacted by the hospital) If you simply say that you are protestant or United Methodist, they do not contact the church. It is our job as a church to support you in times of sickness, and your communication is an important part of the equation. Thank you for your help.
